Born in Japan and raised in Hilo, world-renowned fish printmaker Naoki Hayashi has been making *gyotaku* from his studio in Kaneohe. *Gyotaku*, also known as the art of fish rubbing, originated as an art form in Japan more than 2 centuries ago. This form of fish printing was meant for fishermen to show others what fish they caught. The printing process involves coating one side of the fish with non-toxic acrylic paint and gently placing a piece of shoji paper over the fish. All the fish he prints is later eaten.
